# In Memoriam: Dan Haywood, 1946-2024

Dan attended club meetings during 2017-2018. His favorite model subjects were anything used by the U.S. Marines. Regrettably, we lost touch with Dan after 2018 and only recently found out about his passing early in February. His obituary below reveals his remarkable service to the U.S. Marines, both in combat and through his professional life. --- Editor



"Danny Gilbert Haywood, a man of unwavering dedication to both his family and his country, passed away peacefully at his home in Mechanicsville, Virginia, on February 28, 2024, at the age of 77."

"Born to the late Thomas and Josephine Haywood on September 25, 1946. Danny spent his formative years alongside his two brothers in Portsmouth, Virginia. Danny's life was marked by service and sacrifice. After graduating from Woodrow Wilson High School, he answered the call to duty

and joined the U.S. Marine Corps. His valor and commitment during his tour of duty in Vietnam earned him two Purple Hearts, a testament to his courage and resilience. Upon returning from the battlefield, Danny pursued higher education at Virginia Tech, where he earned a degree in mechanical engineering. His career continued in service to his nation, with several years at the Naval Surface Warfare Center. It was here

that he honed his engineering skills, drawing from both his combat experience and his unwavering belief in safeguarding the warfighter. This principle guided him throughout his entire career. In his final role as Director of Ground Weapons at Marine Corps Systems Command at Quantico, Danny worked tirelessly to enhance the safety of his fellow marines in combat. His dedication and expertise earned him numerous commendations, including the prestigious Chinn award for significant contributions to small arms and infantry weapons systems. Beyond his professional achievements, Danny had a rich and diverse life. He found solace and joy in woodworking, the rhythmic dance of a fly-fishing line, and the intricate art of model building (both cars & tanks). His passion extended to his grandchildren, who affectionately called him "Poppy". Danny was a man of contrasts-strong-willed and stubborn, yet possessing an enormous heart and an infectious sense of humor. His loyalty and bravery defined him as a true warrior. He will forever be remembered for the love he shared with his family and friends. Danny leaves behind a legacy of love and memories. He is survived by his devoted wife, Pam; his daughters, Kadee (Jeff) and Beckie (Scot); his brother, David (Janet); three stepchildren; five cherished grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews. Their lives were enriched by his presence, and his absence will be deeply felt."

# March Demo - Making Clear Lenses With Clear Sprue

Nowadays, clear lenses are often included in kits. These make the best and realistic depictions of lamp glass. However, sometimes those lenses are flat and without the engravings like real lamp glass. You can make your own using simple tools and materials. Here are the notes from Ashley's demo.


Materials (refer to the image below)

- Heat source: cigarette lighter, candle, etc.
- · Clear plastic sprues from kits
- Formers to simulate the engraving on real lenses. Ashley
  uses an assortment of photo-etched brass grills and mesh,
  depending on the effect needed. In addition, a run of staples
  is good for simple parallel engravings.
- Glue for clear parts: Ammo Ultra Glue. Comes in both a matte and gloss formula. Ashley prefers the matte.





















- 1. Heat the sprue next to the flame until it melts.
- 3. Results!
- 5. Twist and pop it loose.
- 7. Press the melted sprue onto a run of staples.

- 2. Press the melted sprue into a photo-etched brass mesh former.
- 4. Press into a existing kit part.
- 6. Results from a side profile.
- 8. Results!



Trumpeter Soviet KV-3 in 1:35 scale by Mike Zador

"This is a Trumpeter KV-5. As with the KV-3, parts fit well with little clean up or filing. I included a picture with a Panzer Ia just for size comparison. Primed with Rustoleum rattle can gray primer." --Mike



# **AMPS-CV Workbench:**

Adventures in figure painting in 1:35 scale

I decided it was time to begin including figures more with my models, which

triggered a journey over the past couple of months trying to research and reacquaint myself about figure painting with acrylics. After practice working out the kinks, these were the last ones I painted and two will be selected to man an upcoming BT-7 Vignette. All are 3D printed figures from

Panzer Art. As you can see, there are only three different faces but with different head cover options. I liked the guy with the cap on the left the most. I'd like the second figure to have a tanker helmet. The helmets have only been primed in flat black and not shaded/highlighted yet.





Trumpeter Soviet KET-T in 1:35 scale by Scott Bregi

Several photo-etched brass frets and windshield painting masks are included. The tires are rubber and although adequate, aftermarket ones made from resin would be better. The towing arm can be installed deployed or stowed. Although these are

great features, the kit lacks a drive gearbox and associated parts. It also has open access to the engine compartment but no engine is included. The (significant) front bumper has fragile attachment points.





Italeri German Panzer I Ausf.B in 1:35 scale by Matt Zador This is an OOB build that more emphasis will be paid to experimenting with painting and weathering. It was painted first with AMMO One-Shot Primer, followed by Dunkelgrau. But it seemed too dark and

was subsequently lightened with Field Grey and Cream only to be too light! Black and Dunkelgrau was added to land on what is seen here.



# Pass and Review from March



Tamiya German Panzer II Ausf.F in 1:35 scale by Matt Zador Matt used cotton balls taped to the model to soften the airbrush pattern, but said it didn't work too well and would not recommend it. This model is Dunkelgrau underneath Dunkelgelb. The barrel upgraded is made of aluminum with a 3D printed muzzle.





Tamiya US M18 Hellcat in 1:35 scale by Alex Valz It's a good kit that includes enough interior to see via the open turret. The tracks are link and length and worked pretty well. The tow cable is nylon string from the kit. Alex

used the water-slide decals in the kit for the markings and they were easy to apply.





Takom Israeli Merkava Mk.IIB in 1:35 scale by Alex Valz Not much to show yet, but so far, so good. Shown at front is the track jig included with the kit to properly assemble and shape the track runs. The paint is Israeli Modern Grey

from the AK-Interactive Middle East War Colors paint set.





Dragon Egyptian Sherman with FL-10 Turret in 1:35 scale

by Jason Jennings

The kit is inaccurate for this version, even missing the distinctive exhaust deflector. Jason built that from scratch, replaced the suspension with ones from Tasca and used a turret from Takom. Weld lines were added

and the tool mounts upgraded with photoetched brass.



# Pass and Review from March

Rye Field Model US M36B1 conversion in 1:35 scale by Jason Jennings

The base kit from RFM is a M4A3E8 Sherman that has a full interior, which according to Jason is the best Sherman kit out there. The turret is from AFV Club and the suspension

from Tasca. The "low rider" suspension is not how the final model will look!





Panda Soviet BMD-2 in 1:35 scale by Tabb Tharrington

The antenna is music wire and the periscopes have AFV Club reflective material scraps. The markings are painted

by hand. The paints are by Gunze Sangyo with some chipping with a silver pencil to mimic scratches down to the aluminum hull of the real vehicle. Weathering is an airbrushed layer of AK Interactive Kursk Summer Soil streaked with a paintbrush moist with enamel thinner. Dry pigments

are held in place with fixative. The lower hull has more extensive weathering using AMMO Splashes. The base is made from XPS foam and the earth made from VMS Smart Mud. The weeds are dried products from Hobby Lobby. The figure is from Master Box with Live Resin head, helmet and boots.





# Hobbyboss US AAVP7A1 in 1:35 scale by Tabb Tharrington

The kit is nice, with a complete interior. The stowage includes both Tamiya ALICE

and Legend MOLLE packs. The rope is nylon string soaked in thin CA glue. The kit's individual tracks were assembled, painted and masked so the model could be painted. The stowage was painted last. The markings were applied using stencils from


Alliance Model and hand made ones from tape. The base is XPS foam with balsa wood trim. The road is Asphalt material from AK-Interactive. The road guard rail is from Meng. The sign is constructed of styrene with a plaster base and Echelon decals.





Vargas Scale Models US M1 Combat Car in 1:35 scale by Mike Petty The markings are the 13th Cavalry Regiment form 1938-1939. The model was painted Mission Models #25 Olive Drab.





Takom US M29 Weasel in 1:35 scale by Mike Petty

This is a small subject in 1:35 and of course the kit parts are also small. The suspension has many parts and placement is a bit of a challenge. The sprocket and idler wheels each have multiple parts with the idler having a tiny photo-etched brass ring to install.





Vargas Scale Models US T7 Combat Car in 1:35 scale by Mike Petty Only one of these were made during trials of new light tank designs in 1937-1938. Yes, those are pneumatic-tired wheels, intended for use without the tracks. This kit is mostly molded in large sub-assemblies - the suspension is a single piece unit.





Hobbyboss US T34 in 1:35 scale by Glen Martin Since last month, Glen applied a dark wash, painted the exhausts and applied markings using a stencil. A layer of hairspray underneath the markings enabled chipping to add to the overall distressed look.
